


# **Students Survey**

#### Main subjects:



- > 78% of students are interested in interacting with international students.
- > 84% are interested in studying a course together with international students.
- > 83% would like to have more opportunities to meet international students.
- Only 20% actually had a chance to meet and interact with international students.




In your opinion, what are the major setbacks for interaction between Israeli and international students?



In case you took part of a joint course with international students, what was the level of positive influence of the participation of international students in different aspects?




## **Staff Survey - Results**

- ➤ As part of a separate survey for the academic staff, professors teaching joint courses claimed that Israeli students had gained a lot more from the joint course in comparison to a regular course.
- > In their opinion, the heterogeneity had contributed to the academic experience.






➤ What were the main advantages of learning together with international students in a joint course?





What were the main challenges of learning together with international students in a joint course?







- ➤ 61% of student are not obligated to learn a content course in English during their studies.
- > 85% of students said that a requirement for taking a content course in English did not effect how the chose their study programs.


Does your academic institution offer study programs / internships abroad during your studies?








Does your academic institution offer study programs / internships abroad during your studies?




Opportunities for studying/ internship abroad



- About a quarter of students studying in institutions that offer programs abroad are planning to participate in one of them.
- > The reasons for not participating are usually financial or personal situations.



➤ If they could, most students would be interested in participating in programs abroad.




- They are interested in:
  - ➤ Short programs (interest levels go down in long programs) 44% few weeks, 27% semester, 16% one year. 12% full degree.
  - > Programs the combine studying with internships, 47% Equal but lower interest in studying alone 16%, or only an internship 17%. 20% have not decided yet.






> If you are interested in participating in a program abroad, where would you like to go?






To what extent do you agree with the following statements?




> To what extent do your academic studies provide you with the following skills or opportunities?




### **Lecturers Survey - Results**

> Academic staff survey: To what extent should academic studies provide students with the following skills or opportunities?



On what level does your academic studies curriculum combine the following content types?



- Only 23% of students had learned with an international professor during their studies.
- > They claim it was mostly a good and interesting learning experience thanks to:
  - > The professor's different teaching methods.
  - > The professor's different and wider point of view.
  - > The opportunity to practice their English.
- > Some did feel great difficulties, especially because they have struggled with the language.
- ➤ 60% of students who did not learn with an international professor would be interested in a learning experience in a foreign language.





### **Students Survey - Conclusions**

- > There is a great interest in interacting with international students, but it comes across a major setback the lack of opportunities.
- > Students see several clear advantages of studying in a joint course with international students.
- > The main challenge facing Israeli students in a joint course is learning in a foreign language.
- > A mandatory content course in English is not expected to influence Israeli students choice of study programs.

### **Students Survey - Conclusions**

- ➤ Most students are interested in participating in programs abroad specifically in short programs, which include internships, and are located in Europe or north America.
- ➤ The problem many students do not know the programs offered by their institution, and cannot join these programs due to financial or personal status.
- > The Israeli students feel the their academic studies helps them achieve only a low level of relevant international skills and abilities.
- > There are clear advantages of learning with an international professor, and most students are interested in this experience.
