internationalisation.

 Internationalisation is one of the main pillars of the institution communicated from the beginning to the students and contained in all official communication









organisational aspects.

- The collaboration between the international relations office and the departments is very close
- Everything regarding the specifics of the studies is the responsibility of the study department (for instance courses, compensations).
- The whole organisational part is the responsibility of the international relations office (IRO).









exchange semester.

- There is a fix exchange window in all the studies.
- The exchange (one semester) mainly takes place in the fall term i.e. the fifth semester in the bachelor's studies and in the third semester in the master's studies.
- In part-time studies, a two-week study trip is offered instead.







exchange semester.

Intercultural sensibilisation workshops offered:

- before mobililty: assessment and input

- during mobility: reflection paper

- after mobility: individual feedback session

partner selection and evaluation.

- Partner universities are initally and continuously evaluated with the study programs (courses, semester terms, location, language)
- Some possible partners are suggested by lecturers or our Rector.
- Partners are otherwise actively searched for at conferences such as NAFSA, APAIE or EAIE.
- More than 250 partners (balance ensured through short programs)








forms of exchange.

- Most partners are exchange partners (in Europe Erasmus +, outside Europe bilateral agreements). This means exchange is offered on a tuition waiver basis.
- Some partners are study abroad partners, where our students may study on a tuition paying basis (for instance some partners in America, Australia)
- Free movers but not at partner universities.
- Double degrees are offered as well, mostly in the Master's studies. This means two semesters at home university and two semesters abroad.


- Information session three semesters before going abroad (partners, language requirements, other specifis, Erasmus procedures).
- Nomination session two semesters before going abroad.
- Application process one semester before going abroad.








information session.

Information on partner unversities can be found on SAKAI (student platform) per department with places, language, website, specifics, reports)









information session.

- Information session is held together with the study program (information on process and course requirements).
- All the details are on SAKAI (student platform):
 - presentation
 - deadlines
 - checklist
 - preliminary learning agreement
 - partner list
 - international semester guidelines







nomination.

- All students are present when deciding on their exchange place.
- Students are ranked according to their GPA.
- Language requirements have to be handed in during the nomination session.
- After the allocation of the place the students will be nominated at the university abroad.







application.

- Outgoings are entered into MCI software (designer).
- The courses are agreed upon between student and study program (syllabi), mostly based on last year's courses of the partner university.
- The courses are entered by the student in the online learning agreement (student platform). Therefore the documents are always accessible to the students.
- Students apply at the partner university and hand in the required documents (transcript, insurance, recommendation letter, bank statement).
- After receipt of acceptance letter, students apply for visa (if needed).







application.

- In Europe the required ECTS have to be met.
- Outside Europe the full course load of the students at the partner university serves as the basis (hours or credits).
- Courses at partner universities are mostly in English.
- Courses should be chosen from one department and level.




 Changes during mobility are as well agreed upon between student and study program (syllabi) and entered in the online learning agreement by the student.

- When students fail in their exams, they are either retaken at the parner university or at MCI under our supervision. Otherwise compensated through MCI-courses from the international program or through compensation work.
- At the end of the studies, the students write a report, which
 is uploaded as information for other students. It contains
 information on courses, the city, housing, leisure activities,
 costs etc.
